Lettie Walker McKinney Roach, 94, of Lexington, KY passed away peacefully at her home on May 25, 2021. She was born in Stanford, KY on May 17, 1927. Preceding her in death were her parents, James Walker and Douglas Craig McKinney, her husband of 44 years and the love of her life, S. T. Roach, and two sisters, Helen Rose and Addie Pearl.

Lettie was educated in the Lincoln County Public Schools, and was a member of Turnersville Baptist Church in Stanford, KY. After graduating from Lincoln High School in Stanford, she attended Kentucky State University where she earned a BS degree in Elementary Education in 1950. She taught and tutored for many years in the Fayette County Public School System, and retired July 1, 1983 after 33 years of faithful service.

After moving to Lexington to teach, Lettie united with the Main Street Baptist Church on December 19, 1959 under the services of former Pastor R. H. Johnson. A faithful member of Main Street Baptist for over fifty years, Lettie was one of the founding members of the Anne Worthington Coleman Scholarship Committee. She was a quiet member who could always be called upon to do just about anything. Aside from her church, Lettie was a member of Links, Inc., Carpe Diem Club, and a Pearl member of Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority.

Lettie dearly loved her family and the Main Street Baptist Church. She also enjoyed traveling, whether with family or friends. She especially loved her students who she often spoke of even during her final days. Then, there were those UK Wildcats. For her, the world actually “stopped turning” whenever there was a basketball game. Lettie loved sewing, and was a skilled seamstress. She also had a passion for hats. Sometimes she designed and made them from scratch; other times she modified those she bought. She loved cooking, and especially enjoyed baking cakes, either to sell or just give away. (Her caramel icing was to die for!!) It’s hard to even imagine, but Lettie swore she never ever ate any of her own cakes. Instead, she opted for the Coconut cakes purchased from Sam’s Club.
