Anthony dedicated eleven years of his life to honorable service in the United States Army, achieving the rank of Sergeant. Beyond his professional life, Anthony was known most for his witty personality, generous spirit, and wise words that touched the lives of all who knew him. Music was his passion; he found joy in singing and playing the guitar. He also cherished his time spent fishing and riding his motorcycle.

Anthony is survived by his loving wife, Toherana Coleman, who was his devoted partner.
