was done in love. Daniel was a man who loved sports, video games, wrestling, collecting M&M character dispensers, and anything dealing with autos and trucks. Even though he spent a lot of time on the road, he would always make it a point to be in town for the Truck Show and Carl Casper's Auto Show.
