Dorothy Stallard Huskey Durham, 69, was born on July 27, 1951 in Frankfort, Kentucky. The ninth child out of eleven to the late Joseph Henry and Florence Scott

years in Louisville, she returned to Frankfort with her family and worked for Kentucky

State Government (Department of Agriculture). After 25 years of service with the State

Government, she retired in 2008. After retiring from civil service, she worked at Furniture

Liquidators.

She loved to take care of her family and others. She would do whatever she needed

to make sure they were well taken care of even if it meant changing her living situation.

She also loved to shop for herself as well as others.

While residing in Louisville, she opened her home up to children in her neighborhood and women with small children needing assistance while getting on their

feet. The children would call her Aunt Dot, Miss Dot or Granny. She would take them on

fishing and road trips, letting them be kids, but they had to follow the same rules as her

own children.
