



## Paul L. Dunn

September 12, 1923 - December 14, 2016

Paul L. Dunn was born on September 12, 1923 in Lexington, Kentucky to the late Walter and Lucille Gilbert Dunn. Paul accepted Christ at an early age at Gunn Tabernacle Church where he was a charter member. Later, the church merged with Wesley United Methodist Church where he continued to commit his time, talents and gifts. He served on many committees. Among them included the Trustee, Finance and Building committees.

Paul graduated from Paul Laurence Dunbar High School in May 1941 where he starred on the basketball team. After graduating from high School, he became a member of the U.S. Army where he was stationed in New Guinea and the Philippines. After serving his time in the military, he opened a dry cleaning business while attending the Bluegrass School of Business.

He eventually sold his business and began his illustrious career with the U.S. Army Civilian Service at the Lexington Bluegrass Army Depot. Over the years, he worked his way up the ladder to leader, supervisor, project officer, branch chief, division chief and then shop superintendant. Additionally, during his tenure with the Depot, he traveled extensively to Germany, Korea, Vietnam and supported the Operation Desert Shield/Storm.

Paul was active in his community as well. He served on the Governors Board of Economic Security, addressing the administration of welfare funds. He also served as the chairman of the Housing Clinic for the Human Rights Commission. Additionally, he served as a member of the United Community Fund and Infantile Paralysis Program.

He was proceeded in death by one sister Lucille Dunn Weathers, six brothers: Arthur, Walter Jr., John Gilbert, James, George and William Dunn.

He is survived by his wife (Eva Dolores), 3 sons: Paul Lexington, KY, Phillip (Gala) Pasadena CA, William Paul, Calera, AL, One daughter Dolores Aryonne (Kenneth) Green Lexington, KY and a host of nieces, nephews, grand children, great grand children and friends.
