Although Randall had been vaccinated, he contracted covid. While being treated for covid, Randall contracted an infection referred to as hospital acquired pneumonia. Randall bravely fought these infections for several weeks.

Randall was born in Jamestown, KY. His parents were Willie Mae Clayton Garr and Clarence Garr.

Randall was raised in the Baptist faith. He later was baptized into the Christian (Disciples of Christ)

faith. Randall enjoyed the old gospel music. His favorite hymn was “Rock of Ages, Cleft for Me.”

Randall graduated from Henry Clay High School with honors in 1969. He earned a scholarship to

attend Wesleyan University in Middletown, Connecticut. He majored in English and graduated in

1973. At this time, Randall developed his lifelong pastimes—reading adventure novels and

writing poetry. After college, Randall held several public service positions.

Randall then decided that he wanted to see the world. He enlisted in the United States Navy.

During his service, Randall received the National Defense Service Medal.

tractor-trailer truck. As a long haul trucker, Randall transported goods throughout the country.

Randall left his trucking career to spend more time with his family. He was employed by Trane

and worked there until retirement.

Randall is survived by one brother (John Garr) and four sisters (Joyce Newsome, Janet Jackson, Wanda Garr, and Donna (Vincent) McCullom).
