Terence Wayne Tolley was born in Lexington, Kentucky on August 22, 1966 to Robert Harold and Catherine Ann Tolley. Terence was raised in Lexington and attended Glendover Elementary, Lexington Junior High School and Henry Clay High School. Terence exhibited an inclination towards music at an early age and played the clarinet from elementary to high school, while also playing percussion in high school. Terence professed a belief in Jesus Christ at an early age and regularly attended Shiloh Baptist Church's Sunday School and Worship Services as a youth.

Terence always displayed a good work ethic and started working full time at Duff's Smörgåsbord at the age of 16. Terence went on to work at Good Samaritan Hospital in the Culinary Department for 5 years before moving on to Central Baptist Hospital where he worked as a switchboard operator for 22 years. Terence was a loyal, faithful and loving son, and took care of both his mother and his father as they became ill in their later years, devoting his life and his work to their care until they passed. This devotion to the care of his parents in life and in death was an inspiration to all who knew Terence.

Terence hailed from a large family where he had four brothers and four sisters in Rosiland (Jessie) Tolley, Theresa (Larry) Price, Robert (Angela) Tolley, Phillip (Tony) Tolley, Phyllis (Kevin) Mayo, Paul Tolley, Erica (Anthony) Tolley and Mark Tolley. Terence also had three special, life-long friends in Gerri Botts Lilly, Jason Raglin and Terae Winchester; and a host of nieces and nephews who affectionately called him "Uncle Terence."

Terence was a Disc Jockey (D.J.) who played many venues in Lexington and the surrounding area, where he was known as "T-Magic." He was also a big Sci-Fi fan and had an impressive collection of Star Wars memorabilia. At one time, he collected and traded comic books as a hobby.

Terence loved and supported his siblings, close friends, co-workers and family members until his death on April 28, 2022. In reminiscing, no one in our family can think of anyone Terence ever did wrong. He was no saint, but

he was one, truly-loving human being with a heart bigger than his stature.
